



FISHERIES FACT SHEET



Competitive Fishing Event Licence Conditions For Summer (Open-water) Events

The following is a comprehensive listing of Competitive Fishing Event Licence conditions for summer (open-water) events. Depending on the licence type and issue date, the conditions that apply to a particular licence may vary.

Event organizers and participants are required to follow all conditions attached to the Competitive Fishing Event Licence and are also encouraged to adopt all applicable best management practices in the handling and release of fish.

Small Competitive Fishing Events

A **Small Competitive Fishing Event** is defined as an event having 26 to 75 participants and prize value totalling less than \$1,000.00

The following conditions apply to all **Small Summer Competitive Fishing Events**:

Organizer Conditions

1. The organizer must clearly post a copy of the event licence, conditions, participant list (see condition 5) with directions on how and where to contact the organizers.
2. All event advertisements or postings must include the Competitive Fishing Event licence number issued for the event.
3. A copy of the event licence, a signed copy of Schedule "A" and the organizer's Event Rules must be provided to all registered participants.
4. The organizer must complete and return a Competitive Fishing Event Reporting Form and associated worksheets within 14 days from the conclusion of the event.
5. The organizer must maintain a list of all participants that are registered for the event noting which participants were issued a registration package.
6. Competitive Fishing Events must be planned and executed in a manner that complies with the current Alberta Fishery Regulations applicable to the water body.

Organizer and Participant Conditions

7. Organizers/Participants shall only measure, weigh-in or harvest the species identified on the Competitive Fishing Event licence.
8. Organizers/Participants shall not fizz* fish or attempt or practice fizzing fish (see the definition of “fizz” and “fizzing” fish at the end of this document).

Participant Conditions

9. All participants in a licensed competitive fishing event must have a valid Alberta Sportfishing Licence (except those legally exempted from the Alberta Sportfishing Licence requirement i.e. youths and seniors, or during a designated Free Fishing Weekend).
10. Before participating in a Competitive Fishing Event, all participants must ensure they have been registered by having their name included on a list of participants that is maintained for the event, and that they have received a copy of the event licence, a signed copy of Schedule "A" and the organizers event rules.
11. All participants fishing under the authority of a Competitive Fishing Event Licence must follow the Alberta Fishery Regulations for the water body specified on the license. Participants may only fish in areas open for fishing.
12. Participants of Competitive Fishing Events who catch a fish, the possession of which is prohibited by the “Alberta Guide to Sportfishing Regulations” or Event Rules, must immediately return the fish to the waters from which it was caught, and release it in a manner that causes it the least harm.
13. Fish that are not immediately returned to the water must be of a size of fish that is lawful to retain under the daily catch limit for the water body as specified in the Alberta Guide to Sportfishing Regulations.
14. Participants shall not bring, in total on any day, more fish to the weigh-in than the number of fish specified as the daily limit per person for that species in the current Alberta Guide to Sportfishing Regulations.

Medium and Large Competitive Fishing Event

A **Medium Competitive Fishing Event** is defined as an event having 26 to 75 participants and prize value totalling in excess of \$1,000.00. A **Large Competitive Fishing Event** has greater than 75 participants and prize value totalling in excess of \$1,000.00.

The following conditions apply all **Medium and Large Summer Competitive Fishing Events**:

Organizer Conditions

1. The organizer must clearly post a copy of the event licence, conditions, participant list (see condition 5) with directions on how and where to contact the organizers.
2. All event advertisements or postings must include the Competitive Fishing Event licence number issued for the event.
3. A copy of the event licence, a signed copy of Schedule 'A' and the organizer's Event Rules must be provided to all registered participants.
4. The organizer must complete and return a Competitive Fishing Event Reporting Form and associated worksheets within 14 days from the conclusion of the event.
5. The organizer must maintain a list of all participants that are registered for the event noting which participants were issued a registration package.
6. The organizer shall ensure that all fish that are measured or weighed are handled in a manner that causes them least harm and that they are released back into the waters from which they were taken.
7. The organizer shall maintain a reporting form recording all dead fish and the number of stressed fish that may not survive. All dead fish must be packed on ice and stored in a clean insulated container.
8. All dead fish must be disposed of in the following manner:
As specified by Fish and Wildlife in consultation with event organizers
9. After a fish has been weighed for the purposes of the competition, no person shall transport that fish by boat to a release location. After a fish is weighed, it must be released directly into the lake from the weigh-in site. The weigh-in locations must be designed for immediate release of fish into open water. Release sites must have 2 to 3 meters of water depth, be separated from areas with regular boat traffic and dense weed beds.
Note: A staging tank is permitted, that allows fish to be held in water when transferring them from boat live wells to the weigh-in and a recovery tank is permitted to temporarily hold stressed fish.
- 10. No shore-based weigh-in facilities are permitted during the months of July/August.**
11. Competitive Fishing Events must be planned and executed in a manner that complies with the current Alberta Fishery Regulations applicable to the water body unless otherwise specified in **condition 24** below.

Organizer and Participant Conditions

12. Organizers/Participants shall only measure or weigh-in the species identified on the Competitive Fishing Event licence.
13. Organizers/Participants shall not fizzle* fish or attempt or practice fizzling fish (see the definition of "fizz" and "fizzling" fish at the end of this document).

14. The organizer must schedule and provide two (2) periods during each day of the event for weighing-in of fish that have been retained for the purpose of the competition. A participant shall bring in fish for weigh-in during the first available period after the fish was caught and retained.
15. All event organizers and participants must, during the hours that the Competitive Fishing Event is operating, wear a visible form of identification that indicates they are involved in the event.
16. Live wells must be equipped to aerate and exchange or re-circulate water and such aeration or water re-circulation equipment must be operational at all times that fish are in the live well.

Participant Conditions

17. All participants in a licensed competitive fishing event must have a valid Alberta Sportfishing Licence (except those legally exempted from the Alberta Sportfishing Licence requirement i.e. youths and Alberta seniors, or during a designated Free Fishing Weekend).
18. Before participating in a Competitive Fishing Event, all participants must ensure they have been registered by having their name included on a list of participants that is maintained for the event, and that they have received a copy of the event licence, a signed copy of Schedule "A" and the organizers event rules.
19. Participants fishing under the authority of a Competitive Fishing Event Licence must follow the Alberta Fishery Regulations for the water body unless otherwise specified in **condition 24** and may only fish in areas open for fishing.
20. Participants shall not intentionally kill any fish taken during the Competitive Fishing Event during the period that the licence is valid to operate the Competitive Fishing Event.
21. Participants of Competitive Fishing Events who catch a fish, the possession of which is prohibited by the "Alberta Guide to Sportfishing Regulations" or Event Rules, must immediately return the fish to the waters from which it was caught, and release it in a manner that causes it the least harm.
22. Participants in this Competitive Fishing Event must practice immediate catch-and-release for all fish species caught during the event except for the species identified on the face of the Competitive Fishing Event licence.
23. Fish that are not immediately returned to the water must be of a size of fish that is lawful to retain under the daily catch limit for the water body as specified in the Alberta Guide to Sportfishing Regulations.
24. Participants shall not bring, in total on any day, more fish to the weigh-in than is allowed for that species in the "Alberta Guide to Sportfishing Regulations" for that water body unless specified in Schedule "A", which are the conditions attached to the Competitive Fishing Event Licence.

25. A fish can be retained only briefly and for the purposes of measuring or weighing or both.

*“To fizz fish” or “to practice fizzing fish” refers to the practice of releasing, or attempting to release air from the air bladder of a fish caught from deep water.
